A Play for the Living in A Time of Extinction Miranda Rose Hall /Katie Mitchell / Malin Stenberg

What happened to the lesser noctule bat? And what about eelgrass? And what will happen to Homo sapiens? An unprepared dramaturge, forced to go on stage when the regular show is suddenly cancelled, can't resist telling a story about life on earth and what people are doing to the planet.

A Play for the Living in a Time of Extinction is a monologue by the American eco-feminist Miranda Rose Hall, about our responsibility/ability to do something about the looming environmental disaster. Not only is the theme of the play sustainability, but it was also produced with sustainability in mind. The production is part of the STAGES project and explores the potential to produce sustainable theatre that can tour without travelling. The electricity for the performance is generated by cyclists on stage.

Katie Mitchell – a successful British director with three acclaimed plays at Dramaten under her belt and featured at the Bergman Festival in 2012 with Miss Julie – has devised an artistic concept that is produced locally by directors and actors at several different theatres across the world.

Malin Stenberg


The production at Dramaten is directed by Malin Stenberg, who has directed several plays at Dramaten to date, most recently Pussy Riot – a punk prayer by Irena Kraus. She has also directed plays at numerous theatres and opera houses in Sweden, most notably Jeanne d'Arc at Backa Teater, Förklädd Gud at Folkoperan, and Ædnan at Giron Sámi Teáhter and Riksteatern.
